



Eugenio Poma's story, his "journey to dignity" is captivating and inspiring. Born on the in the Altiplano of Bolivia, Eugenio was the first Amayara Indian from his village to attend high school. His journey included time teaching in a tough area of Chicago, returning to Bolivia, and working with the Methodist Church – serving ultimately as the Bishop of Bolivian Methodist Church. The next leg of his journey took him and his wife, Antonia, to Geneva, where Eugenio ran indigenous peoples programs for the World Council of Churches. Always true to his culture and to Bolivia, Eugenio has returned to La Paz.
